 - HP expects these customer requests to increase with the standardization of the “Materials Composition Declaration Guide for Electronic Products”

HP RoHS Business Processes



- HP “Interim RoHS Compliance Specification”
- Supplier signed letter – Verification of RoHS Compliance
- RoHS compliance managed with HP’s Part Data Management system
- HP Supply Chain Social and Environmental management processes
 - Supplier self-assessment questionnaire
 - High Performance Supplier Scorecard
 - Supplier audits,...

- HP expects their supply chain partners to have robust processes for complying with HP's "Interim RoHS Compliance Specification," HP's "General Specification for the Environment," and HP's Social and Environmental compliance requirements
 - HP expects their supply chain partners to respond to HP's Social and Environmental self-assessment questionnaire
 - HP expects their supply chain partners to provide data upon request

Critical Product Content Issues



- Internationally harmonized industry standard criteria for requesting, exchanging and reporting on materials contained in electronic products
 - HP is a member of the RosettaNet consortia, NEMI, HDPUG, EIA, EICTA, IEC and other organizations
